Home-Based Casework Services

Home-based caseworkers provide services for multi-problem and/or dysfunctional families in the family's natural environment. Services can include community referrals and follow up, case planning, family assessment, conflict management, and behavior modification.

Home-Based Therapy

Home-based therapists provide structured, goal oriented therapy to families in need of assistance recovering from physical, sexual, and emotional abuse, or neglect. Midwest staff provides counseling in the family's natural environment to address many different issues.

Homemaker/Parent Aid Services

Homemaker/parent aid workers provide assistance and support for parents who are unable to appropriately fulfill parenting and/or homemaking functions. Midwest staff assist the family by teaching new, appropriate skills in the areas of child care, discipline, and resource management.

Substance Abuse Assessment, Treatment, & Monitoring

Midwest staff conduct substance abuse assessments for individuals experiencing the adverse impact of alcohol and other drugs of abuse.

Outpatient substance abuse treatment includes individual and/or group counseling.

Intensive Outpatient Treatment (IOP) is suited for adults that meet the clinical criteria for a less restrictive means of care than an inpatient setting and includes group/individual therapy & educational activities.

Parent/Family Functioning Assessment

Midwest staff provide thorough evaluations to assess strengths, goals, and concerns of the family. Staff conduct interviews, administer tests, observe the relationship between the child and parent, and assess for safety of the home.

Visitation Facilitation – Parent/Child/Sibling

Visit facilitation is provided between parents/children and/or siblings only who have been separated due to a substantiated allegation of abuse or neglect. Midwest's visitation supervisor provides a positive atmosphere where children can reconnect and reestablish relationships in a safe, structured environment.

Diagnostic and Evaluation Services

Diagnostic and assessment services are used to determine if physical, sexual, or emotional abuse or neglect is present in the household. Midwest staff conduct a variety of services including psychological evaluations, drug and alcohol testing, and the Minnesota Multiphasic Personality Inventory, 2nd Edition.

Transition from Restrictive Placement (TRP)

Transition from restrictive services are designed to assist youth and families in the transition from the most restrictive placement to a less restrictive placement.

Midwest staff provide home based services while the youth is incarcerated, and continue with services after the youth has been released.
